Congratulations New Eagle Scouts: Gopal Jayakar, Isaac Messner & Dylan Grupe

Gopal Jayakar, Eagle Scout #180

Gopal Jayakar was a Cub Scout in Pack 82, and crossed over to join Troop 31 in August, 2009. Gopal has held a number of leadership positions in the Troop, including Webmaster and Assistant Senior Patrol Leader. For his Eagle Service Project, Gopal designed and supervised the construction of a garden project at Radio Park Elementary School in State College. Raised plant beds were constructed that now contain a variety of plants that students can help maintain, and some will provide food that can be used in the cafeteria. Fourteen volunteers spent over 53 hours with this project. Gopal has been a long time volunteer at Mount Nittany Medical Center, and has contributed over 300 hours of service at the hospital.

Gopal graduated as an honor student from State College Area High School. He participated in many activities including officer positions in the National Science Bowl team, the National Ocean Sciences Bowl team, Technology Student Association, and the Computer Science Club. He has been accepted in the Schreyer Honors College at Penn State.

Isaac Messner, Eagle Scout #181

Isaac joined Troop 31 in June, 2009 after crossing over from Pack 383. Isaac advanced quickly, and reached the Life rank in August of 2012. He has made many contributions to our Troop, but what really stands out is his leadership. Isaac has served as Patrol Leader, Den Chief, Troop Guide, ASPL, and two terms as our Senior Patrol leader. For his Eagle service project, Isaac worked with the State College Assisted Living facility to help design and create a green space, that included a garden, flower boxes, bench, and plants. By the time the project was completed, 45 volunteers contributed 188 hours of service for this wonderful additional to the facility. See photo on right.

Isaac graduated from State College Area High School and was a member of the track and cross country teams, and was active with the TSA organization. He will be going to college this fall to study biology, and eventually go to medical school.



Dylan Grupe, Eagle Scout #182

Dylan began his Scouting career as a Cub Scout in Pack 50. He crossed over to become a Boy Scout in Troop 31 in March 2011. Dylan has held a number of leadership positions in the Troop including, Troop Guide, Patrol Leader, Scribe, and Asst. Senior Patrol Leader. He enjoyed attending many summer camps including the high adventure canoe trip to Sabbatis Camp, Camp Seph Mack, and Seven Mountains Camp. Along the trail to Eagle, Dylan has earned a total of 33 merit badges, and plans to work on earning several Eagle Palms. For his Eagle project, Dylan worked with personnel at Centre Region Parks and Recreation to rebuild, repair, and improve the irrigation system for the Community Gardens at Tudek Park. He provided leadership for the 15 volunteers who contributed over 35 hours of labor for this worthwhile project.

Dylan is an honor student at State College Area High School, is very active in music, culinary arts, and the Gaming Club. His goal when he graduates is to attend CalTech to study astrophysics.
